More Information

An exhibition dedicated to the history of Surrealist art in Britain organised as part of the Gallery's recognised programme of Modern British Art. The exhibition explores the roles played by literature, sculpture, cinema and photography alongside the crucial

paintings to come out of the period and examines their artistic, political and intellectual significance in this country. Also included is a number of works by so-called 'pre-Surrealists' - artists and writers such as Henry Fuseli, William Blake, Samuel Taylor Coleridge and Lewis Carroll. The lead cast of Reclining Figure (LH 101) was included in the First International Exhibition of Surrealism in 1936, London.
