Published as an album in deluxe and standard editions containing a text in English by the artist and twelve etchings CGM 196, 197, 199-201, 226-232, with CGM 225 on the cover. The deluxe edition has four additional etchings CGM 198, 233-235. 305 x 387mm: 16 unnumbered pages in 4 leaves and twelve etchings on Rives, unbound within thin card covered with vellum, with CGM 225 on the front and back, contained in a light brown cloth-covered Solander box 330 x 410mm with a vellum label bearing the title mounted on the front. Designed by Gérald Cramer, Geneva. Text set in Bodoni and printed by Fequet et Baudier, Paris. CGM 196 to 201, 225 to 235 were printed by Atelier Lacourière et Frélaud, Paris. The Solander boxes were made by Bernard Duval, Paris.
